

Grade 6 Spelling Bee – Student Information Sheet

What is a Spelling Bee?

A **Spelling Bee** is a fun competition where students spell words out loud. You will be given a word to spell. If you spell it correctly, you stay in the game!

We are using **60 words- 4 LEVELS** that we have studied in class. Review them carefully to prepare!

How the Game is Played

1. The teacher (or host) will say a word clearly.
2. You must:
 - Repeat the word
 - Spell the word out loud, one letter at a time
 - Say the word again to finish

Example:

Word: *travel*

You say: “Travel. T-R-A-V-E-L. Travel.”

3. If you spell the word correctly, you move to the next round.
4. If the spelling is wrong, you are out of the competition.

You Can Ask For Help

Before you start spelling, you may ask the teacher:

- “Can you say the word again?”
- “Can you use it in a sentence?”
- “What does the word mean?”

(These questions are allowed only before you start spelling.)

Time Limit

You have **30 seconds** to spell your word. Be confident, speak clearly, and try your best!

Winning

- The last student remaining in the game is the **Spelling Bee Champion!**
- All students will receive a **certificate of participation.**

Study Tips

- Review the full list of 50 words given in class
- Practice spelling each word out loud
- Ask a family member or friend to quiz you

- Be respectful and cheer for your classmates. 😊
